Students are expected to read the book and to maintain a reading log which must be signed by parents. This reading log will be due to your Reading teacher in August and will be your first grade in your Reading class. A completed log will receive a grade of 100. Incomplete logs will receive no credit.\*

These titles have been chosen for their cross-curricular applications and global appeal. Teachers will design lessons and activities that include applications in other subjects and will support Common Core reading objectives.
